Minutes – March 5 Meeting

President Mark Tennant called the rescheduled meeting to order at 1 pm. Six members present.

Jim Allman made motion to dispense with reading of last meetings minutes as they were published in Dispatch. Ken seconded.

Treasurers Report \$4,376.32.

Jim made a motion to allocate to each active unit within the WVRA which has at least 3 members active and current WVRA members, the normal \$100 "unit funds." Ken seconded the motion. Passed 6-0.

Tim Glaser said 25th and USV insurance has been paid for 2016.

Broke into unit meeting.

Voted on sanctioning Beverly event in July. With the vote of all present and the absentee ballots, 15 voted to sanction; nobody voted against, and 5 abstained. A majority of members having voted to sanction, the Beverly event is now sanctioned by the WVRA.

Beverly Heritage Days

At the March 5 meeting, the Beverly Heritage Day event was approved as a WVRA Sanctioned Event.

Beverly Heritage Days — Centuries of History are scheduled for July 22 through July 24 at Beverly, W. Va. This event will be a "timeline" featuring living history and other programming from periods throughout Beverly's history. By timeline, the intent is to allow living history from multiple time periods. Preliminary planning shows living historians from the pioneer and Native American, Civil War and World War II periods. However, other periods may be represented.

Civil War History Showcased Through Song in Hansbarger's *Dream of a Good Death*

The Monroe County Historical Society is hosting a performance of Clark Hansbarger's multi-media Civil War show *Dream of a Good Death* at 7:30 pm on Saturday, April 2nd at the Ames Clair Hall in Union, West Virginia. Admission to the evening is \$10, students \$6. Tickets available at the door, seating begins at 6:30.

Songwriter and Monroe County native Clark Hansbarger's *Dream of a Good Death* traces the arc of the Civil War from its beginning to its end. Part folk opera, part multi-media lecture, this cycle of original songs follows the trials, hopes, fears and sacrifices of Civil War soldiers as they struggle through the Union conquest of Port Royal, the fires in The Wilderness, the killing fields of Cold Harbor, and the long siege of Petersburg.

Each song is introduced with stories and historical photographs, enriching the audience's appreciation of the songwriting and providing an historical thread. The human tragedy and costs of war are experienced in a new way through the deeply personal lens of each song's protagonist.

Dream of a Good Death has been performed throughout Virginia to large audiences, receiving good reviews from a variety of notable sources. Historian and author Howard Means describes Dream of a Good Death as "one of the most imaginative approaches to the Civil War I've ever witnessed. In short, terrific entertainment — the rare evening that leaves you better informed and fully satisfied."

Clark will be joined on April 2 by his daughter Kara on vocals and his band The Bitter Liberals. The Bitter Liberals' two records "13" and "Again" have together received six Wammie nominations from the Washington Area Music Association, including Best Group and Best Recording in the Folk-Contemporary category, Best New Artist and Best Debut Recording. The band performs regularly to large audiences at venues including The American Theater in Hampton, VA, Winchester, Va's Bright Box, and Shepherdstown's famous Old Opera House.

Springfields

Gentlemen,

As an old Springfield shooter, I (*Kevin Skaggs*) have seen that problem before with the Lock Plate screw being a bit too long and it interfering with the hammer. As you said, back the screw out just a little and the hammer will clear it. Just remember to check the screw before and after a battle to make sure that you still have it.

The biggest problem with an 1861 Springfield is that it will misfire A LOT. The easiest way to correct that is add an extra step to the load. After "CHARGE CARTRIDGE" and you go to the "READY" position before "PRIME", turn the musket over so that the lock plate/hammer is pointed toward the ground and then hit between the two lock plate screws with the heal of your hand. What this does is to knock a little bit of powder into the chamber below the nipple so the spark from the cap will not have to make a 90 degree turn to fire the main powder charge.
